



What is the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD)?



CCHD is the domestic anti-poverty program of the U.S. Catholic Bishops. CCHD works with Catholic dioceses and their bishops to award grants to local, low-income community groups working to address the causes of poverty. By helping the poor to participate in the decisions and actions that affect their lives, CCHD offers a hand up, not a hand out, helping people and communities overcome injustice, escape poverty and build bridges of solidarity.

CCHD was created in response to a mandate from the U.S. Catholic bishops in 1969 to address the root causes of poverty in the United States. CCHD provides funding to groups whose activities are consistent with Catholic moral and social teaching and who work to help persons who are poor help themselves.

CCHD provides funding to groups whose activities reflect Catholic moral and social teaching on human life and dignity. CCHD-funded groups work to change social structures and policies which undermine life and dignity, especially for the poor and powerless.

CCHD is an example of how the Catholic community reaches out to involve and support people who are poor in acting together to improve their lives, overcome injustice and escape poverty. CCHD is a sign of how the Church lives out the call from Scripture and Tradition to give special concern and priority to the needs of those who are poor and vulnerable.

The Catholic Campaign for Human Development is carrying out the mission of Christ to **“bring good news to the poor, liberty to captives, new sight to the blind, and to set the downtrodden free” (Luke 4:18)**

CCHD also works to educate Catholics about poverty and its causes in our nation and to help the non-poor put into practice the Church’s concern for human life and dignity, the Gospel command to care for “the least of these” (Matthew 25) and the Holy Father’s call to practice solidarity in helping people who are poor help themselves to overcome injustice and escape poverty.

What is Pro Life?

Are we sure we are 100% Pro Life?



The Church teaches that all life is sacred and must be cherished and protected from conception to natural death. By keeping this guiding principle in mind in reviewing all the following moral issues of today, we can quickly see what it means to be 100% Pro Life, no exceptions.

Abortion

This is defined as the removal of an embryo before it can survive outside the uterus. While it may not look or function completely as a baby, it is still a baby. All things are what they are at their inception. By not protecting and nurturing an embryo, we have taken the life of a little boy or girl.

Now we have to ask the difficult questions for some. While many people are against abortion in general, and still calling themselves prolife, they take exception in the following cases: rape, incest, or severe mental or physical birth defects in the unborn child. Those exceptions to abortion are not prolife, because they are not protecting *all* life. We cannot take the life of any unborn child, regardless of their condition or the circumstances of their conception. **The child is innocent, created by God in His image, and deserving of God’s plans for His life here on earth.** If you believe that Abortion is wrong, then you are Pro Life on this issue. *Joann Murray, Lucas, Texas*
