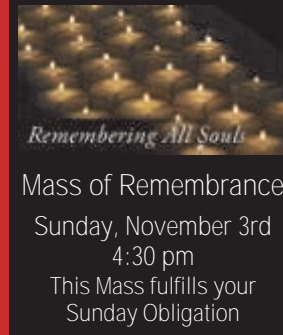

### All Saints Day



I heard a story the other day of a very holy man. The commentator said, "We shouldn't call him a saint. If we sanctify him, we don't have to imitate him." This is precisely the opposite of the meaning of saints! Throughout the Church's history, we have honored saints, but not to set them apart. We honor saints to remind us what is possible for a person who loves God. The saints have stories as varied as our own. We have bishops, martyrs, teachers, doctors, former thieves and prostitutes, politicians and kings, soldiers and pacifists, single mothers, desert hermits, the list goes on! On this Solemnity of All Saints, we remember this garden of holiness, rich with diverse flowerings of a holy life. When you look at the life of your favorite saint, ask yourself:

"How can I imitate this person?  
What is possible for me when I love God?"

God, who gives life to all who believe,  
You dwell in unapproachable light,  
yet Your mercy leads those who hope in You  
to a place in Your presence before Your throne.  
Grant light and peace to our brothers and sisters

### November is Called the Month of All Souls

More recently, it has been called the *Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed*. November 2nd, the *Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed*, dovetails with November 1st, the feast of *All Saints*. The saints, our models of Christian living, are one with God in heaven. All the faithful departed are those who have died with hope and trust in a loving God who calls us to greater growth and development, even beyond death. This growth and development occurs in a state of being that we have traditionally called purgatory.

While the Western Church has emphasized the cleansing and purifying nature of purgatory, the Eastern Orthodox Church has emphasized the growth and development aspect of it. Today, belief in purgatory allows one who has died in Christ to continue growing and developing before meeting God face to face. God continually invites communion with these loved ones, but some feel the need to continue growing and developing before entering into full communion with God.

These November feasts vividly remind us of the rich reality known as the communion of saints. This belief stresses the strong affirmation that the church is always one in Christ. Death does not sever any of the bonds that unite us in Christ. That is why it is a fitting practice to pray for the dead and to ask them to pray for us. Just as we do that for each other when we are alive, so, too, do we continue that bond and concern for each other even beyond death.

Helping Hands Has a New Home

Helping Hands very talented volunteers constructed our new storage building over the summer months. We are now in the process of moving and organizing our new space. It is such a good feeling to have our own space after storing items in barns, funeral home, garages and sheds over the last 23 years.

Eight (8) volunteers will be leaving for Jamaica on October 28th and returning on November 13th. We will be building two (2) houses and going into several schools, as well as teaching knitting and helping in a medical clinic.

Helping Hands will be taking a group of volunteers to Kenya on January 7th until February 3rd. Our plan is to build seven (7) houses, outdoor kitchens and latrines, spend time in four (4) schools and working with the Maasai.
